This follows a request from the Clerk of the Zambia National Assembly for CIDRZ to review the proposed bill and suggest amendments.

Zambia Surpasses UNAIDS 95-95-95 Target



Zambia has made significant progress in the fight against HIV/AIDS, surpassing the UNAID 95 95 95 target.

Speaking at the 16th Annual HIV/TB/STI/Viral Hepatitis Conference in Lusaka, Minister of Health Dr Elijah Muchima celebrated this achievement, noting that over 1.3 million Zambians are on Antiretroviral Therapy (ART), new HIV infections have reduced in eight years, and AIDS-related deaths have dropped by over 60% in the last decade. CIDRZ Hosts Inaugural Person-Centred Care Advocacy Academy in Lusaka



The United States Agency for International **Development Tuberculosis** Local **Organisations** Network (USAID-TBLON) Chief of Party, Dr Mary has said that Kagujje, Drug-resistant tuberculosis patients could (DR-TB) now be placed on a shorter treatment regimen called BPaL/M with fewer tablets in 2024.

The regimen, which requires only seven (7) tablets daily, replaces the previous MDR-TB regimen, which required 21 tablets daily. Read More...

Zambian Government Launches National Strategic Plan for Infection Prevention and Control (2022-2032)

The Zambian government, with support from, WHO and CIDRZ's CDC supported PROUD Z project, recently launched the National Strategic Plan for Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) 2022-2032, a comprehensive initiative to equip healthcare providers, caregivers and patients with knowledge to implement and adhere to effective infection prevention measures.



The plan, launched by Minister of Health Dr Elijah Muchima, emphasised the government's commitment to enhancing Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) services within health institutions.

In a speech delivered on his behalf by Ministry of Health Permanent Secretary for Technical Services, Dr. Kennedy Lishimpi, the Minister of Health highlighted that in 2022, President Hakainde Hichilema mandated that no new health facility would be built without basic WASH services, adding that since then, all newly constructed health facilities have been equipped with boreholes provide running water flushable toilets. 
